RIGA DOM BOYS' CHOIR PERFORMS AT THE WHITE HOUSE

At the beginning of June, the Riga Dom Boys' Choir visited New York, Washington, DC and Philadelphia. The highlight of their visit was performing at the White House on Sunday afternoon, June 6. The choir, conducted by Martins Klisans, performed at the Ford's Theater Annual Gala, held at the East Room of the White House. The high point of the afternoon was their opportunity to meet US President Barack Obama and First Lady Michelle Obama, who greeted the choir and expressed appreciation for their professionalism and accomplishments. The Boys' Choir performed five pieces at the black-tie event, including Latvian folk songs and works by contemporary Latvian composers.

This is the first time a choir from Latvia has met with a US President and performed at such a high-profile event at the White House. The opportunity to perform at the White House in front of 400 guests, Ambassador Pildegovics stated, "is a strong, emotional gesture of friendship, affirming how highly the US President regards Latvia and its culture." 
Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Tutu, singers Lionel Richie and Kelly Clarkson.
